**TRAINING GOD'S PEOPLE** 

I would like to thank you for your support of our London Challenge 2012 Lenten Initiatives to assist the Ministry and Mission of our partner Churches in Angola and Mozambique. Over the last three years we have raised over £240,000 for education, water and children's projects. It is good to see tangible results: the Diocese of Niassa has plans to use its portion of the 2010 Appeal to support 4575 Orphaned and Vulnerable children with school supplies and, with the 2009 funds, has a rural water supply project which includes mending, servicing and installing wells and hand pumps. Messumba school is now thriving and Nsosso school is nearing completion. See ALMA website <u>www.almalink.org</u> for more details of these past Lent Appeal Projects.

I commend the 2011 Lent Appeal **'Training God's People'** to you and the people of your parishes. Our partners in both Angola and Mozambique are experiencing remarkable organic growth. The church in Niassa has almost doubled in size since 2005 and the Angolan church is now present in 10 of the country's 18 Provinces and is about to officially open in another 2 in 2011.

Our 2011 Lent Appeal in London is designed to help our partners build up the church so it can better love and serve her people: the harvest is indeed plentiful but the workers are few, and there are many obstacles to training. These include finding and resourcing trainers who have the capacity, mobility and language skills to travel across vast distances to deliver training; funding trainees to enable them to reach regional hubs and their subsistence during training – particularly in rural regions where there is minimal transport infrastructure; cost and availability of appropriate materials in local languages and the difficulty of training against a background of poverty and very low formal educational levels. We rejoice that so much has already been achieved and hope to see this encouraged and multiply with the results of the 2011 Lent Appeal.
